The classic 'Keep Calm and Carry On' poster gets the cheeky royal treatment.

It's anarchy in the U.K.... at least where poster artists are concerned.

Graphic designers are having a ball creating posters and billboards to commemorate the [April 29 wedding of Prince William and Kate Middleton](#).

[Allposters](#) is offering 20% off hundreds of posters featuring all the main characters of the House of Windsor, from Princess Diana to Queen Elizabeth. There are childhood photos of [Prince William](#) and countless shots of [Kate Middleton](#) -- in case you've forgotten what she looks like.

But check out the cheeky designs of Will and Kate that play off all things British, from plaid to the [Sex Pistols](#).

The now-classic "Keep Calm and Carry On" poster, created in 1939, has been updated for the royal nuptials.

"Keep Calm, [Harry is Still Single](#)" reads one. "Keep Calm, It's Only a Royal Wedding."

What would the punk band the Sex Pistols think of these homages to the royal couple?



After all, in 1977, the Pistols wrote their now-classic punk anthem "God Save the Queen" as a direct rebuke to the British government and the royal family around the time of Queen Elizabeth II's Silver Jubilee.

In 2011, there's still some of that anti-royal feeling in the air. There is [a growing Facebook effort](#) dedicating to the idea of downloading and blasting "God Save the Queen" on the day of the wedding, driving the song to number one.
